

Breaking the Code

Utilizing Morse code and a simple phrase you will design an abstract quilt with a unique repeating pattern. The approach relies on simple piecing to create an infinite number of different designs.

Supply List.

One yard each of three different **high value/color** contrast fabrics. (Try to come with fabric ironed as irons will be in short supply)

Rotary cutter, ruler and mat. (You will be cutting the width of the fabric. If you want to cut some ahead of time you can cut up about 6 strips at **1.5 in** across the width of the fabric. But make sure it stays flat and ironed. (Don't cut up all the fabric!)

Neutral piecing thread (50 wt. cotton).

Scissors

Straight pins

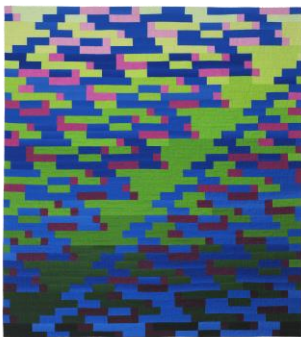
¼" square graph paper. (4 squares to the inch)

Colored pencils

Small wooden iron or Hera tool for pressing small seems.

Seam ripper.

Something to put your **small** cut pieces in like a small pizza box.
